






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


Public Health Hangs in the Balance



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


Revised SDOH Framework created by Ruqaiijah Yearby (2020)

Who Should Apply?

Collaborative applicants should have a commitment to (1) addressing the health impacts of climate change, (2) advancing racial health equity, and (3) using law and policy as tools to achieve these goals.

Applicants may include but are not limited to individuals working in:

- Public health departments
- Community based organizations
- Climate justice, climate equity, and health equity organizations
- Housing, water, transportation, agriculture, and energy organizations
- Legal organizations and departments
- Hospitals, clinics, health care systems and organizations
- Local, state, tribal, and federal government
- Foundations and funders

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Climate Change and Health Equity Summit
